

**ORDINANCE NO. O-2020-54**

**AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE STREET NAME CHANGE OF ALAMO CROSSING TO ALAMO CROSSING ROAD, SAID THOROUGHFARE COMMENCING AT THE INTERSECTION OF SOUTH VINE AVENUE AND ALAMO DRIVE AND CONTINUING WEST UNTIL ITS TERMINATION WITH A CUL-DE-SAC. PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**WHEREAS**, it is the intent of the City Council to protect the public health, safety and welfare; and

**WHEREAS**, municipalities may, under their police powers, enact reasonable regulations to promote the health, safety and welfare of citizens; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Tyler is a home-rule municipality acting under its Charter adopted by the electorate pursuant to Article 11, Section 5 of the Texas Constitution and Chapter 9 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

**WHEREAS**, Texas Local Government Code Section 51.001(1) provides that the governing body of a municipality may adopt, publish, amend, or repeal an ordinance, rule or police regulation that is for the good government, peace, or order of the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, Texas Local Government Code Section 51.001(2) provides that the governing body of a municipality may adopt, publish, amend, or repeal an ordinance, rule or police regulation that is necessary or proper for the carrying out of a power granted by law to the municipality or to an office or department of the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, Texas Transportation Code Section 311.001(a) states that a home-rule municipality has exclusive control over and under the public highways, streets, and alleys of the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, Tyler City Unified Development Code, Division F, Section 10-260, governs name changes of rights-of-way and thoroughfares; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the public interest to change the name of a public street as set forth herein;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TYLER, TEXAS:**

**PART 1:** That the name of Alamo Crossing is hereby changed to Alamo Crossing Road along the entire length of the street, as described, to-wit:

**I. APPLICATION N20-001**

Commencing at the intersection of South Vine Avenue and Alamo Drive and continuing west until its termination with a cul-de-sac, and is shown in the drawing attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein.


**PART 2:** That the purpose of this street name change is to clarify the street naming convention for postal service.

**PART 3:** That the City Manager is hereby ordered and directed to cause City of Tyler maps to be amended to reflect the above described street name change.

**PART 4:** That if any provision or any section of this ordinance shall be held to be void or unconstitutional, such holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining provisions or sections of this ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

**PART 5:** That this ordinance becomes effective upon adoption of this ordinance.

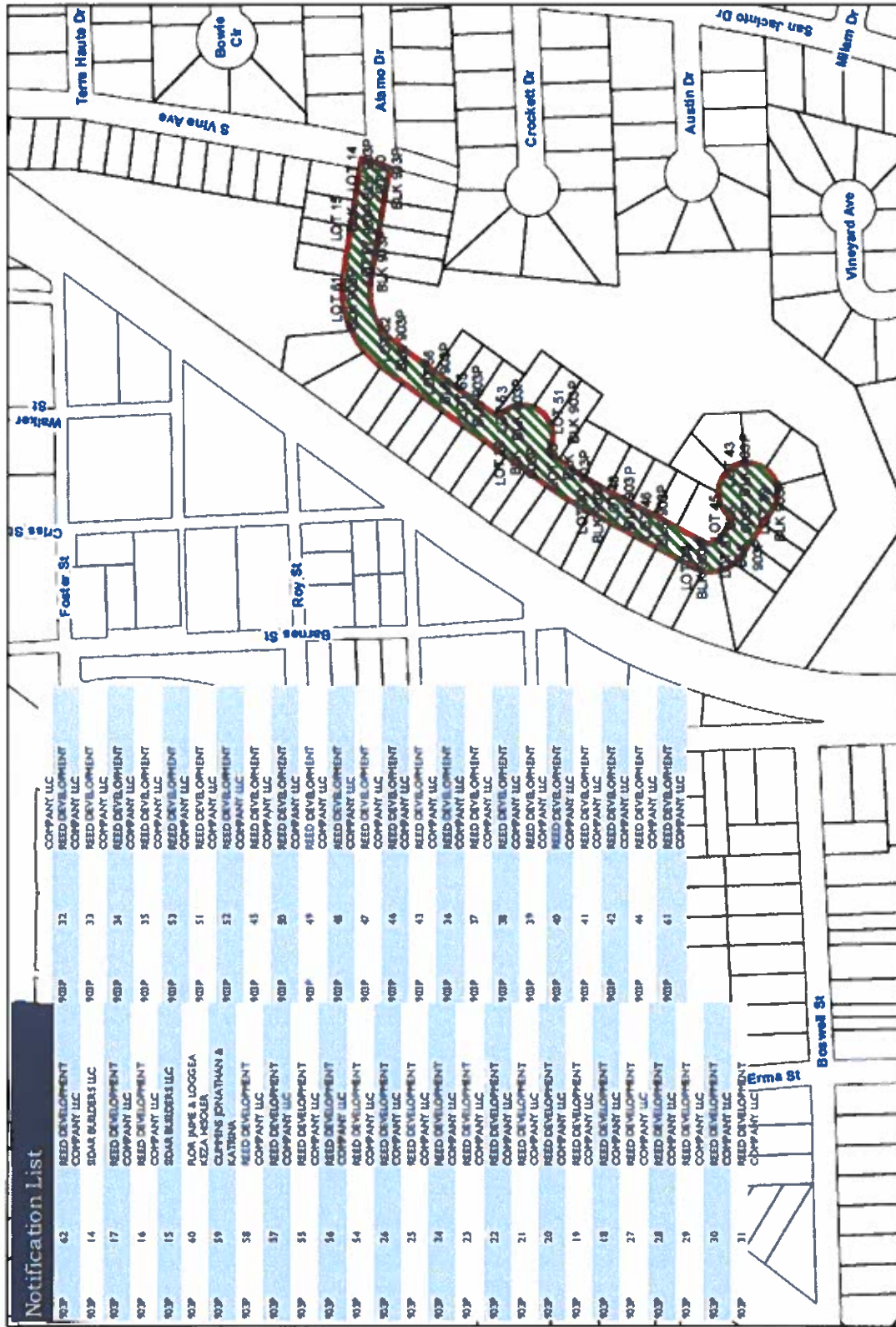
