


South Tyler Mobility Study



NEW COPELAND ROAD

The City of Tyler is proposing a 2-mile extension of New Copeland Road from Grande Boulevard to Paluxy Drive.

The four-lane roadway would be divided into two segments—north of Jeff Davis Drive and south of Jeff Davis Drive—and would include sidewalks and bike lanes. Other proposed work includes constructing a bridge over Shackleford Creek, installing a traffic signal at Paluxy Drive, and constructing turn lanes at intersections.

PROJECT BENEFITS:

-  Provides significant improvement in traffic operations, resulting in a 30% decrease in vehicular delays.
-  Results in \$7.8 million in delay savings per year.
-  Improves connectivity.
-  Facilitates connection to future development in the area.
-  Improves emergency response times.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR THE PROPOSED PROJECT:

- The project needs to consider and avoid floodplain impacts.
- Right of way would be needed.
- Project funding has not been identified.



The estimated cost for these proposed improvements is \$66.8 million. At this time, the estimate does not include right-of-way acquisition costs.
