

RESOLUTION NO. R-2025-37

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TYLER, TEXAS, SUPPORTING THE CITY OF TYLER'S APPLICATION OF THE MIDTOWN TO DOWNTOWN TRAIL PROJECT, FOR THE TEXAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION 2025 TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES SET-ASIDE (TA) CALL FOR PROJECTS, COMMITTING LOCAL MATCHING FUNDS, AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Tyler City Council to protect the public health, safety, and welfare; and,

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation issued a call for projects in January 2025 for communities to apply for funding assistance through the Transportation Alternatives SetAside (TA) Program; and

WHEREAS, the TA funds may be used for the development of preliminary engineering (plans, specifications, and estimates and environmental documentation) and the construction of pedestrian and/or bicycle infrastructure. The TA funds require a local match, comprised of cash or Transportation Development Credits (TDCs), if eligible. The City of Tyler would be responsible for all non-reimbursable costs and 100% of overruns, if any, for TA funds; and

WHEREAS, all projects must demonstrate an enhancement to pedestrian safety, access to or between existing community investments in bicycle and pedestrian facilities, public transportation or other mobility options, or propose a direct connection to important community destinations; and

WHEREAS, the TA/SRTS program includes on and off-road trail facilities for pedestrians, bicyclists, and other non-motorized forms of transportation; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TYLER, TEXAS, THAT:

PART 1: The City of Tyler supports funding this project as described in the 2025 TA Detailed Application (including the preliminary engineering budget, if any, construction budget, the department's direct state cost for oversight, and the required local match, if any) and is willing to commit to the project's development, implementation, construction, maintenance, management, and financing. The City of Tyler is willing and able to enter into an agreement with the department by resolution or ordinance, should the project be selected for funding.


PART 2: That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.


