
Seedling Giveaway

The City of Tyler and Keep Tyler Beautiful are announcing once again a public art opportunity at Hillside Park located at 1111 E. Erwin St.


Project details and artist's guidelines are listed on the [application](#).

The Hillside Park Art Wall was built in 2019 as part of the renovations of Hillside Park. The 200-foot art wall features 19 panels of original artwork painted by local artists. The wall will feature new artwork every other year.


Artists must submit their artwork via email by **Feb. 28**. The selection of artwork will be announced in late March. Painting of the panels by artists will begin in April.
